

Infection Control Preventionist Standards of Practice and Certification Review

LEARNING OUTCOME:

Participants will be able to identify current standards of Infection Control and Prevention in nursing practice and apply them to selected patient conditions.

OBJECTIVES:

- Recognize the benefit and responsibility to patients and healthcare workers of adhering to infection preventions.
- Recognize the professional's responsibility to monitor infection prevention and control practices to assure compliance.
- Identify the factors which influence the outcome of an exposure to pathogenic organisms in healthcare settings.
- List strategies for preventing transmission of pathogenic organisms and application to practice.
- Describe specific high-risk practices and procedures that increase the risk of exposure to potentially infectious material and measures to prevent transmission.
- Identify work practice controls designed to eliminate the transmission of bloodborne pathogens during use of sharp instruments.
- Discuss the circumstances that require the use of barriers and personal protective equipment.
- Define cleaning, disinfection, and sterilization with identification of levels of disinfection.
