Learning Objectives: Demonstrate effective lobbying techniques to drive legislation that provides safe staffing, protects nursing practice, addresses the ongoing staffing crisis, and promotes universal and equal access to high-quality care, including advocacy for the New York Health Act. Nurses will summarize the value of the legislative visit and analyze the written testimony and research data related to the proposed state budget and legislative priorities.

In order to receive contact hours and CEUs, you must attend the entire session, perform 2 lobby visits, fill out the relevant form, complete the post-program quizzes, and fill out an evaluation form at the end of the program.
